Reflections on Today's Readings April 18 Third Sunday of Easter

Reading 1: Acts 5:27-32, 40-41.


"Better for us to obey God than men". Peter defies the Sanhedrin, whose members have demanded that they (Peter and the Apostles) cease teaching about "that name." Empowered by the Spirit, Peter upbraids the Sanhedrin, reminding them that they were the ones who killed Jesus. The members of the Sanhedrin are infuriated and want to kill the Apostles but they fear the reaction of the people, who hold the Apostles in great esteem. Gamaliel, a wise Pharisee, proposes that the Apostles be released after being flogged. "If it is a human thing," Gamaliel counsels, "it will destroy itself; but if it is from God, you will not be able to destroy it and may destroy yourselves."

Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13.

"I will praise you Lord, for you have rescued me."

2nd Reading: Revelation 5:11-14.

"Worthy is the Lamb that was slain". Every creature in heaven give blessings and honor, glory and might to God the Father and the Son. The vision echoes John the Baptist's prophecy: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." Jesus is now the Passover Lamb, slain to redeem us from our sins and raised from the tomb by God to sit in glory at His right hand.



Gospel: John 21:1-19.

"Then the disciple Jesus loved cried out to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' On hearing it was the Lord, Peter threw on some clothes." The disciples have toiled all night and caught no fish. Jesus appears, tells them to cast on the other side of the boat and immediately their nets are full. Only when their nets are full does the beloved disciple realize it the Lord. The disciples, still building the faith they need to recognize the Lord, find that they need Jesus if they are to catch fish. Later, they will need him even more as they are sent forth to bring mankind into the net of Jesus' salvation. Jesus waits for them on shore as a servant, tending the fire and providing bread to go with the fish.

After their meal, Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him. Peter, perhaps still sensitive to his triune denial of Christ on the night of His betrayal, responds the first two times, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." When Jesus continues to press, asking the third time, Peter responds with more intensity, "Lord, you know everything. Your know well that I love you." Jesus responds three times to Peter's affirmations of his love: first, "Feed my lambs;" then, "Tend my sheep; and finally, "Feed my sheep."

Pope Benedict XVI, in his first encyclical, "Deus Caritus Est." teaches us of the three Greek words for love: Eros, the love between a man and a woman; Philia, the love of friendship and Agape, the Biblical notion of love manifested by Jesus when he laid down His life for us. Jesus means "agape" all three times when he asks Peter if he loves Him. Peter responds all three times with "philia," apparently not feeling himself worthy to use "agape."

Once the exchange is completed, though, Peter finally understands that Jesus has completely



forgiven and accepted him. He is now assured that his denials and uncertainties have been washed away in the "Blood of the Lamb," and has the hope that we express in today's opening prayer: "God our Father, we look forward with hope to our resurrection, for you have made us your sons and daughters, and restored the joy of our youth."
