4th Sunday of Advent

"The Lord's are the earth and its fullness; the world and those who dwell in it. For he founded it upon the sea and established it upon the rivers." - Psalm 24:1-2

How can we take credit for the good things in our lives when Psalm 24 reminds us that God created absolutely everything and everyone on the earth? Surely we all have an obligation to return a portion of our good fortune to the Lord, for without Him nothing would be possible.

Reflections on Today's Readings

December 19 Fourth Sunday of Advent

1st Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14.

"The Lord spoke to Ahaz: 'Ask for a sign from the Lord, your God; let it be as deep as the nether world or as high as the sky!'...." Ahaz, King of Judah, is between a rock and a hard spot; between earthly power and the power of the Lord. Israel and Syria are pressuring him to join them in an alliance against Assyria. Ahaz seeks to align himself with Assyria against Israel and Syria. Isaiah tells Ahaz that God wants him to avoid earthly alliances and trust in the Lord. Ahaz, unable to place his trust in the Lord, refuses to ask for a sign, but God, undeterred, sends him a sign anyway, a sign of hope: a Son, to be named Immanuel (God with us), will be born of a Virgin.

Psalm: 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6.

"Let the Lord enter; he is king of glory."....."Who can ascend the mountain of the Lord? or who may stand in His holy place? He whose hands are sinless, whose heart is clean, who desires not what is vain."

2nd Reading: Romans 1:1-7.

"Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart to proclaim the gospel of God...concerning His Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh but was made Son of God in power according to the spirit of holiness...." Paul's letters present powerful and persuasive lessons in faith. Here, in the form of a creed of our faith, he describes his apostleship as herald of the Messiah. He reminds us of our responsibilities as inheritors of that apostleship: we are to "spread His name" as we live our faith in the kingdom of God.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24.

"Joseph, son of David, have no fear about taking Mary as your wife. It is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived this child. She is to have a Son and you are to name Him Jesus...." Joseph, betrothed to Mary, and facing difficult choices, is also between a rock and a hard spot. He lives in a culture driven by honor at one extreme and shame at the other, with very little middle ground. Though not yet married, his betrothal to Mary is legally binding. Learning that she is with child, he must decide whether to follow the law and expose her to shame, possibly to death, or to divorce her quietly and risk shaming himself. The angel of the Lord resolves his dilemma, telling him to have no fear: "It is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived this child." Mary, when told by the Angel that she was with child, was momentarily bewildered, but then put her complete trust in the Lord, saying, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

We must put our trust in the Lord. Ahaz, Joseph and Mary all found hope in the midst of adversity. Ahaz rejected the sign of hope Isaiah offered him and put his trust in the earthly alliances he pursued. The long period of exile and alienation from God followed for him and his people. Joseph and Mary placed their trust in the Lord. Mary's "Yes," allowed Jesus to be born into our world; opened the path for Immanuel, "God With Us," to come into our midst. Our long wait is over, our patience has born fruit, our hopes are realized, the reality of the Messiah is here. We are in the kingdom of God!
