
...to all those who served as Liturgical Ministers, you helped us all touch Jesus in a special way

Reflections on Today's Readings

January 9 Baptism of the Lord

1st Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7.

In this, the first of Isaiah's four "Servant Songs," he prophesies of the One who is to come, the One who will "bring forth justice to the nations." Isaiah's prophecy comes from his Book of Consolation as the time nears for the end of the Babylonian exile. He has already proclaimed to the captives that their redemption is at hand. Now, as he begins building their hopes for the reestablishment of the kingdom, he tells them that the One who will bring about justice for them will be a much different Messiah than they expect.

Psalm 29:1-2, 3-4, 9-10.

"The voice of the Lord is over the waters." The Psalmist sings of the peace with which the Lord blesses his people. The image of water suggests the waters of baptism.

2nd Reading: Acts 10:34-38.

Peter preaches to Cornelius and the people, all Gentiles, assembled at Cornelius' house, of the baptism which John brought and of the baptism with the Holy Spirit and power with which God anointed his Chosen One. God had appeared in a dream to Peter, instructing him to meet with Cornelius and offer him and the Gentiles salvation. Thus, the servant of whom Isaiah prophesied, was formed as "a covenant of the people, a light for the nations."

Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17.

Jesus came to John the Baptist at the River Jordan to be baptized. John protested, "I should be baptized by you, yet you come to me!" Jesus answered, "Give in for now. We must do this if we would fulfill all of God's demands." So John gave in. After Jesus was baptized, the sky opened and the Spirit of God descended like a dove and came upon him. A voice from the heavens said, "This is My beloved Son. My favor rests on Him."

John the Baptist was a transition prophet, the last of the Old Testament prophets, of whom he was representative. He stood with one foot in the desert, symbol of the Old Law out of which he came, and the other in the water, symbol of Baptism and gateway to the New Covenant. He heralded the fulfillment of prophecy and the coming of the Messiah in the person of Jesus. All the other Old Testament prophets told their people of the Messiah who was to come. John the Baptist came to tell the people, "Here He is!"

On the Third Sunday of Advent, Jesus told us (Matthew 11:11), "Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." Jesus said this, not to diminish John the Baptist in any way, but to recognize Himself (Jesus) as God's greatest gift of love. The Law, under which John was born, empowered him to cleanse but not to sanctify. We are born of the waters of baptism into Jesus, Son of God; true God and true man. We become the Body of Christ, part of His Kingdom on Earth, and will be a part of His Kingdom in Heaven. Jesus sanctifies us. He shares our humanity with us and, through Him, we share in the very divinity of God. In Christ we have eternal life.

Jesus later told His disciples (Matthew 13:17) how blessed they were to be living in the time when He, the Messiah, was in their midst: "Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it."
