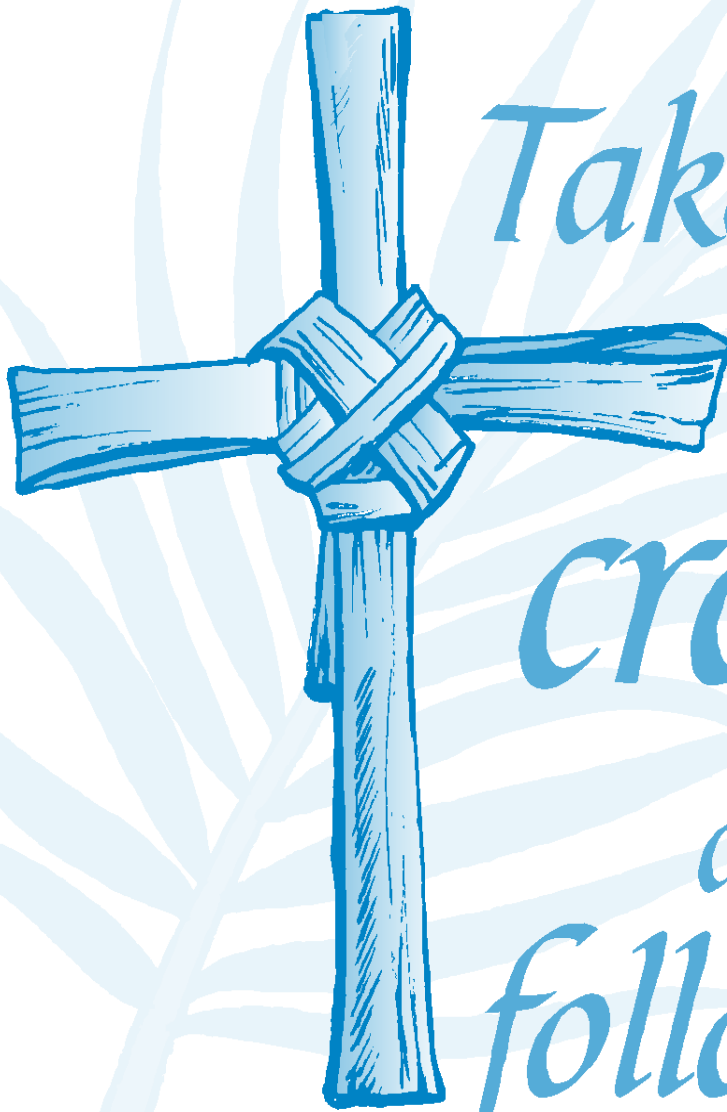

This weekend the parish begins to once again celebrate the Catechetical Ministry. It is a ministry we have all been involved in on many different levels throughout our lives. We are catechists all the time!

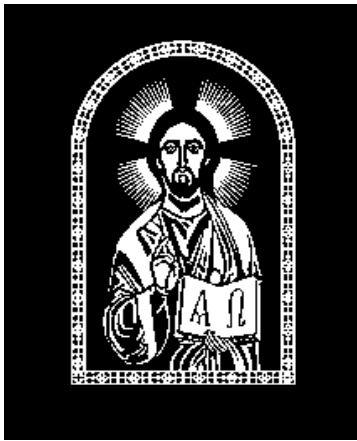
Taste of St. Irenaeus

Why and How Have the Mass Texts Been Revised?

The words we say and hear at every Mass are about to be changed. The changes will not affect the scripture readings, the prayers of the faithful, or your favorite hymns. The changes will be to the words we pray or sing at every Mass and to the prayers that the priest recites from the big book called the Sacramentary. The Sacramentary is now going to be called The Roman Missal.

The third edition of The Roman Missal in Latin was published in 2002. The English translation dates back to 1973. After using this English translation for a generation, it has been revised to come in line with the current Latin translation. These revised translations will have more depth and should bring you to a better understanding of the value of your faith.

The new translation is more formal and though challenging, you will see how the traditional words we use for prayer come from the words of scripture. The longer sentences in the new translation will express more nuances of meaning. The new text will express why we pray and why we hope and how we present ourselves before God. The new verbiage will add freshness to the new Missal as it avoids the needless repetition of some well worn words.

The translation from the Latin that we now use takes some freedom from the structure and content of the original Latin. This translation has served us well. It bridged the gap from praying the Mass in Latin to praying the Mass in English. The translation into the vernacular is here to stay but the original texts in Latin have been reexamined. Some of the changes are small but others are much larger. For example, the Lamb of God has not changed at all but the first part of the Gloria was completely rewritten. The church wanted a translation that says better says what the Latin says.

Many people worked on this project. It was guided by The International Commission on English in the Liturgy (ICEL). Eleven bishops from around the world met. They looked at translations from teams of experts. Back and forth went these translations from the teams of experts to the eleven bishops to the conference of bishops to the ICEL committee and again and again and again. The final translations were sent to Rome where the Congregation of Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments made some final adjustments and approved them.

You will ultimately find some parts you love, and others you don't like at first. Remember that change is hard for everyone. After a time when the new prayers and responses become as familiar as the old ones, we should be able to pray more purposefully at Mass.

The Sacrament of Marriage

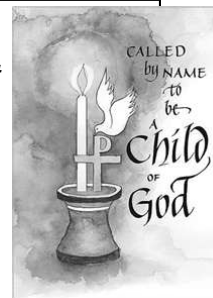
Couples planning to marry must call the rectory at least six months prior to their desired wedding date. All couples must attend a Pre-Cana Conference.
